YCS 2019-20 Learning Improvement Plan

ON STRATEGY report accompanies this Principal's Report.

Mr. Beatty has update two areas of the plan including: 1) EYE-TA used to assess school readiness for learning in Kindergarten. We are currently intervening with six Kindergarten students in areas that the EYE-TA has identified. Five of these students are within the yellow range and one is in the red, and 2) While the school is already set to exceed both provincial and divisional targets in literacy, interventions are ongoing. We recently had three Grade 7 students exit Levelled Literacy Intervention successfully. We not only target end of the grade levels, but of those students not achieving, we are also looking to see that students experience a "year of growth." Currently, 92% of students have already experienced a year of growth. Of the remaining 8%, students may be compared to their individual reading goal as in an IIP. This will be reviewed.

3) We are currently reviewing our most recent Math Screener. Initial results are presenting a string case already.

Bulletin Items

Similar to YCS staff meetings, I am going to include a "bulletin" area that can be read over by parents through the meeting. When the other items of Principal's Report are completed, I will pause for questions related to Bulletin Items.

SCC Orientation: What are Math Screeners?

Over the last 2 years, YCS has used "Math Screeners." Ten fast facts about Math Screeners. Thank you to Mrs. Betge!

- 1. Math Screeners are administered in September with all grade 2-8 students. The content in the math screeners is based on math curriculum from the previous two grades. For example, students beginning Grade 4 are being asked to show competency with content from Grades 2 and 3 math curriculum.
- 2. Speed in processing is not a strong indicator of conceptual understanding. Thus, the amount of time required to complete the screener is not to be limited although the classroom teacher would likely make note of this.
- 3. Students have access to manipulatives while completing the screeners.
- 4. Saskatchewan math curricula are composed of four strands: number, patterns and relations, statistics and probability, and shape and space. The screener only addresses content from the number and patterns and relations strands.
- 5. All of the questions in the screeners are labelled with the concept/curriculum outcome that is being assessed.
- 6. There is a Data Collection Template that accompanies the screeners. The Data Collection Template allows teachers to identify potential individual student gaps as well as potential gaps in previous instruction. Thus, the screeners are designed to be responsive and to inform instruction. Students must score 75% or higher to be considered 'at grade level.' On the Data Collection Template a score of 75% or higher is communicated with a coding of green or blue whereas a score of 74% or less is coded yellow or red.
- 8. The math screeners were developed by former GSSD Math Coach, , along with classroom teachers throughout GSSD. The screeners were developed after assessments from other jurisdictions were reviewed.
- 9. Assessment practices in the mathematics classroom are not limited to pen and paper tasks such as screeners. Strong assessment triangulates data which means a teacher considers conversations and observations as well as pen and paper tasks in an effort to provide a comprehensive picture of student understanding.
- 10. Students who score below 75% in September will be re-screened in April for evidence of growth.

Royals to Raiders

Grade 8 students experienced the Raider Road Show and Raider for a Day. There was a parents evening for the parents as well. At the recent student- led conferences with parents, course options and recommendations were made. Grade 8 students will not complete online course registration on Wednesday, April 3. Mr. Nesseth from YRHS will be here assisting us. The YCS Grade 8 Farewell will continue with the same format at the Gallagher Centre. It will occur on June13 with tickets going on sale shortly before the April Break.

Calder to Yorkdale Central

Calder will be joining Yorkdale Central on April 9th's Persephone Theatre "For Art's Sake." YCS is footing the bill. This is a good opportunity to welcome the incoming families. Mr. Beatty and Mrs. Piercy, Calder School, has discussed some potential date in the future for welcoming Calder again. It may be a good thing to inquire as to what "Royal for the Day" may look like???

Student Accolades

Our school has received word that our school will be receiving at leasts two silver medals from the recent NASP Provincial competition. This is being confirmed, but the medals are likely to be shared at the April 9th assembly, which also includes Persephone Theatre's "For Art's Sake." Our school will also be recognizing students who did well in the Remembrance Day Poster, Poem & Essay Contest.

Beatty Applied for Another Grant

Mr. Beatty applied for another grant. This one is also by Mosaic Makeover Challenge. Mr. Beatty has applied for an innovative project that would transfer our former electronics lab into a CrossFit room. Our school is taxed to get gymnasium time. We get reprieve between Spring and Fall, but winter is long. This would greatly enhance our ability to deliver more physical education and fitness opportunities. Mr. Beatty expects the project to come around \$25000. He is shooting at \$10000 grant, and there may be a need to cover some costs within school, SCC and GSSD. Is there support?

In addition, Mr. Beatty is also aiming high in the Foods Lab, which is due for a large renovation this summer. This may push \$50000. Mr. Beatty is looking at taking some additional expense here as well to get a walk in refrigeration unit. He has received a quote and has shared this with GSSD. This would not required SCC support.



An additional grant from the Government of Saskatchewan was received in September 2017 for the previous raffle. This was 25% of the raffle proceeds raised. I am not certain that this will be received again as it was a government contribution and could depend on budgets etc. and has therefore not been included in the above projection.
